- Consultants in attendance: Jay Borkland, Rich??
- Harbor plan basics
 - o General flow: Proposal → target meeting (wishlist) → a couple iterations with input → consultant does research → Public and regulatory vetting
 - o Full blow plans (Gloucester, Salem, Boston, Fall River, New Bedford) run \$100,000 to \$150,000
 - o Associate plans run \$50,000 to \$100,000 Swampscott fits here
 - o Typical flow is create plan → Review (EOEAA/Coastal Management Review with public input) → Codify plan
 - o No regulatory impact but does provide guidance
 - o If activity fits into harbor plan, it makes it easier to pull permits
