- 5. Review Swampscott draft Capital Project plan and discuss energy opportunities
 - REC will offer assistance in scoping and evaluating options for any energy efficiency and energy management projects (e.g., HVAC systems and controls, window/door/roof replacements)
 - b. REC will assist in researching and developing business case for hybrid/electric vehicle options (Police cruisers, Building Dept. vehicle, DPW equipment)
 - c. Propose that the Town expand the scope of Middle School roof project (#18) to include PV generation. As project timeline approaches, evaluate all current offerings for incentives/discounts/financing.
 - d. Propose new projects: EV charging stations, electric police bikes, energy management system upgrades (e.g., software & devices), studies to investigate the risk to town infrastructure and property from rising sea levels and increased storm severity.
 - e. REC will look out for emerging grant programs and funding opportunities for renewable energy generation/storage/etc.
 - f. In the comments back to the Town, we will raise the IPCC report implications about the need to accelerate energy efficiency and emission reductions (ahead of 2030).
- 6. Approach to collaboration with other Town groups on School development project
 - a. Ryan to connect with Sue D / Ana to restore OneDrive and distribute to REC members so that we can compile our research in a single place.
 - b. Nick to attend Green Build 2018 in November, will present key ideas in December meeting
 - c. We will use ASHRAE publications as core research to inform School design decisions
 - d. Ryan to establish line of communication with Suzanne Wright (School Building Committee) about future collaboration, learn about other members, meeting schedule, etc.
