Approval of Minutes

Approval of the minutes of the February 26, 2024 meeting was moved by Kathy, seconded by Alix; the motion carried unanimously.

1. Resident feedback & DPW reports

In the absence of representatives of Public Works and Public Health, no resident feedback was provided.

2. Open Public Comment

No public being present, there was no public comment.

- 3. **Upcoming Greenworks Tour:** A tour of Greenworks has been scheduled for April 9. There are 10 slots available for members of the public. ACTION: Emily will post the information on Swampscott Nest and Swampscott Patch.
- 4. **Boat Wrap Recycling and Hazardous Waste Disposal are coming up soon.** The Hazardous Waste Disposal is again with Marblehead and is scheduled for April 27. ACTION: Emily will follow up with Jeff and get this information into the newsletter.
- 5. **Closed recycling containers**: Recent windy days have again raised the issue of having a policy on closed recycling containers. We need to consider what a policy might look like and invite the Board of

6. **Library Of Things** discussion Jonathan Nichols, head librarian, and Caroline Margolis, reference librarian, SPL, joined us to talk about this topic. Wayne indicated that we were interested to speak to them to see how can we partner with library, solicit donations for project expansion, or help in other ways.

Concept: Began several years ago, prompted by outages and people had no internet so library bought hotspots. Program has since expanded

Pickleball, hoses, games, puzzles, piano, Power washer 20 internet hotspots 6 Roku devices Has a searchable database Swampscottlibrary.org/library-of-things/ Borrow timeline is 1-2 weeks

ACTION: Matt chasing micro grant for expanded library of things, could be used to expand offerings at Swampscott Library. space could be an issue storing items not in circulation.

How to best put the money to use

Maker space a possibility? Microgrants interested in goods repair for community

Repair center? Bike repair station in parking lot? Swap shed / exchange?

Many potentially appealing items such as cookware or things that require electricity or some degree of hazard are problematic from a sanitation or liability perspective

Renovations to the library are in the Town capital plan and might provide more space for the Library of Things.

Spoke to about 14 Kitchen waste v customer waste issues Cookie Monster sends unused food to My Brothers Table Help is available for business and institutions from Recycling Works Massachusetts (recyclingworksma.com). Funded by the Mass DEP.

Potential projects needing help: Styrofoam dropoff recycling opportunities- investigate opportunities to recycle the styrofoam that is collected each month in the DPW yard. Cardboard opportunities- collection/redirection- explore how MHD transfer station operates Also includes shredded paper. Large rigid plastics recycling- not many options or possibilities for recycling or disposal Is there a minimum amount threshold? Marblehead has an open top dumpster for collecting rigid plastics. Marblehead has a swap shop Andrew Petty- Director of public health runs Marblehead transfer station- reference Wayne, Ask how town handles pickup/disposal Cardboard opportunities- collecting rigid plastics.
