- 8. Council on Aging Budget FY 2023
  - a. Screen shot of proposed budget.
  - b. Requests are for part time kitchen staff and part time van driver.
  - c. Continued requests for Dementia Care and use of the Memory Cafe.
- 9. Capital Plan: Construction of the kitchen is expected to be started by July 2022.
- 10. Report of Friends by Kathie Keiser:
  - a. Students are videotaping; possibility of hard wiring to allow for collaboration with high school.
  - b. Need for an updated TV; possible cost for a new TV is \$4,000. Not expected until January.
