1. COA Promotion Grant:

- Sabrina Clapton and Heidi Whear offered a power point and hard copy of the expected Resource Guide. Suggestions were sought of the Board members, many useful suggestions were made and incorporation into the document.
- Format organized to be age friendly.
- The eight domains of community life were highlighted.
- Board complimentary of the hard work and finished product of the Resource Guide.
- Web Site to be a collaboration between COA and Swampscott For All Ages with a link to Swampscott Friends.
- Grant funding the Resource Guide and Web Site is to be spent by the end of June.

2. Mission Statement:

- International movement toward the re-writing of COA Mission Statements.
- Revised statement had been e-mailed to the board.
- Discussion of revisions to the Mission Statement.
- Approval to accept the revised Mission Statement by Barbara DiPietro, seconded by Jenn Nisbet. Unanimously approved.

3. Kitchen:

- Kitchen renovation is underway.
- Can currently cook and provide meals for 24.
- Budget funding did not provide funds for a cook.
- Meals are currently being provided through a collaboration with the High School.

4. Bathroom Upgrade:

- Friends of COA suggested upgrading the bathroom sinks and countertops.
- If the kitchen upgrade does not utilize all of the funds, there might be funds available for the bathroom changes.

5. Salon:

- Salon is now open every other week.
- Stylist is a licensed beautician and barber.
- Participants reported the first day was a huge success.

6. Swampscott for All Ages:

- Meeting with the Select Board to terminate the former committee and start a new, more manageable committee. It is expected that a number of the former committee members will apply.
- Suggested that the Senior Center set up a table for the Town Meeting.
- Seaglass Village:
- Currently 84 members.
- Reporter from the GLOBE has been in touch and will be interviewing because Seaglass was one of the only community services available during COVID.
- At this time looking for sponsors and vendors.
- Transportation:
- Salem Skipper Program is a possible expansion of it's services to Swampscott.
- Currently looking for funding sources.

7. Age and Dementia Friendly Businesses:

- No new information to offer at this time.
- Deb Newman offered to reach out to Swampscott Restaurants to educate and see if there is interest.

8. New Business:

- Beach Party in July at the Fish House being planned. Discussion of menu.
- Robert Powell asked:
- How do we compare to other area COA's?
- Is the increase of funding in the Town Budget an increase in the senior participation?
- Heidi will research and report at the next meeting.
- Heidi addressed Revolving Fund:
- Some classes are making money and many are free.
- Classes and Activities combined, center has made approximately $\$ 900$.
- Center is breaking even.
