

EARLY VOTING FOR MARCH 3, 2020 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION

We are excited to announce that all registered voters are allowed to vote before Election Day, No Excuse needed! **Early Voting begins on FEBRUARY 24TH through FEBRUARY 28TH, 2020!** Absentee voting is available for registered qualified voters who are: (1) absent from their city or town on Election Day, or (2) have a disability preventing them from going to the polls, or (3) have a religious belief preventing the same, are legally allowed to vote by absentee ballot.

Unlike absentee voting, early voting is for every registered voter. Registered voters do not need an excuse or reason to vote early. Regardless of whether a voter wants to take advantage of early voting, vote absentee or vote on Election Day, the first step is making sure you are registered. To check to see if you are registered to vote, and to find information on how to register to vote, you may visit the Secretary of the Commonwealth's website: www.sec.state.ma.us/ele. If you need to register to vote, you may do so online by visiting: www.RegisterToVoteMA.com. A valid license or I.D. issued by the Registry of Motor Vehicles is required in order to apply online. **To be eligible to vote in the March 3rd Presidential Primary Election, you must register to vote or make any necessary changes to your voter registration no later than FEBRUARY 12TH.**

Also, registered voters have the option to request an early voting ballot through the mail. Simply fill out an application and mail it to Swampscott Town Clerk's Office, 22 Monument Avenue, Swampscott, MA 01907. You can find the application on the Secretary of the Commonwealth's website: <http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele>.

Please note, however, once a voter has cast an early voting ballot, the voter may no longer vote at the polls on Election Day.

Early voting will make the most fundamental right of our citizens more convenient. We encourage all of our citizens to exercise that right and take advantage of the opportunity to vote!
