








Parking Studies – What We Do

- Parking Make it easy!!
 - Available

- Encourage people to park once and visit multiple destinations to shop and dine
- Separate long-term and short-term parking
 - Provide employee parking
 - Long-term in lots, short-term on street
- 85% occupancy is preferred










Q2: Do you think downtown Humphrey Street has enough public parking?






Q3: How do you primarily access downtown Humphrey Street?







Q5: Where do you park most often in downtown Humphrey Street?



Q6: How many minutes does it take to finding parking in downtown Humphrey Street?




Q7: What are the most important factors when you try to find public parking in downtown Humphrey Street? (Select all options that apply)






Q8: Do you think Swampscott is adequately managing parking currently?






Q10: What do you think are reasonable time limits for parking spaces in downtown Humphrey Street?






Q11: Should Swampscott consider charging for parking in downtown Humphrey Street to promote turnover?



- » Loading






Increase turnover on Burrell Street near Library

Turnover desired in this area due to well attended library programming


Consider striping spaces
