Town Awarded \$100,000 Grant for Abbott Park Improvements

Swampscott has been awarded a \$100,000 grant for improvements at Abbott Park, which is next to Clarke School. The funds will be used for improvements to the swing set, toddler play structure and sitting areas to make them ADA accessible.

Thanks to the efforts of Marzie Galazka, Director of Community & Economic Development and her team for securing this grant for Swampscott.

The grant is part of the PARC Grant program announced by the Baker-Polito Administrations in celebration of Climate Week. "Investing in these important open space projects will make Massachusetts parks more resilient to climate change, increase the availability of open space and improve access to the outdoors for people in communities across the state," **said Governor Charlie Baker**. "Our Administration is proud to assist communities and land trusts acquire new land for parks and open space that will make available natural resources for children, their friends and family, and others to recreate locally."

Town Awarded \$50,000 Grant for Climate Action

With the \$50,000 grant the town will hire a consultant - KLA Associates Inc to assist us to develop a Climate Action Plan.

The plan will identify actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and increase resiliency to prepare Swampscott for the inevitable impacts of climate change.

This will be an eight-month process that will result in a plan that will be presented at the Annual Town Meeting.

Solid Waste Advisory Committee tours GreenWorks Recycling Facility

Earlier this month, members of the Swampscott Solid Waste Advisory Committee (SWAC) had the opportunity to tour the <u>GreenWorks Recycling Facility</u> in Peabody.

The facility which is operated by Swampscott's waste hauler JRM Hauling Services (now under new ownership <u>Republic Services</u>) is one of the largest recycling plants north of Boston.

GreenWorks accepts materials such as glass, plastic, metal alloys, paper and cardboard, then sorts and bales them and finally sends it off to mills and manufacturers. The committee members were able to observe the massive machine-sorting process from an observation bridge overlooking the entire plant. Representatives from JRM/Republic were on hand to answer questions regarding the sorting and recycling process.


Recycling

Shooting for a 30% Reduction in Non-recyclable Solid Waste

The town is taking action to achieve a 30 percent reduction in its non-recyclable solid waste by 2030. Pushed up, in part by the Covid-19 pandemic, the town's total tons of non-recyclable waste increased from 2019 to 2020. But, efforts like the one trash barrel limit have helped.

Also our compost rates are improving. Mattress recycling started in March and has resulted in 224 mattresses being recycled. And metal recycling, started in mid-2020, is at 127 tons of metal through 2020.

Main building contract documents will be available to bidders mid-September.


Once a General Contractor is hired they will set up video and narrative pre-blast surveys with households that are within 300' of the school property line; households 300-500' from the property line will be given notice that a pre-blast survey option is available to them. This will occur in the October/November time-frame.

Impacts of Climate Change: They Have Only Just Begun




