Girl Scouts have many events at Fisherman's Beach (bonfires, clean-ups etc.) so it was a natural place to address the litter situation

They began with a desire to reduce beach pollution for the health of both humans and wildlife. They do beach clean-ups in April and September most years at Fisherman's Beach. They found small plastics and cigarette butts to be by far the most polluting items.

They studied sustainable alternatives and brainstormed ways to encourage all beach visitors to do a small part by creating the clean-up kits. Making them plastic-free, they drilled holes in the bottom for drainage and with permission, attached them to the railing. They're hoping their simple solution can create a big impact.

They may build on this project in subsequent years but for now they are proud of this contribution—as they should be!







New Benches on the Forest River Conservation Area Connector

New Benches Offer Rest and Reflection on the Forest River Conservation Area Connector

Thanks to Swampscott Middle School (SMS) students, the Swampscott DPW, and High School volunteers, there are now two benches along the Forest River Conservation Area Connector trail offering hikers a chance to rest and enjoy views of Thompson's Meadow wetlands (pictured). Working with Thomas Butler, technology engineering teacher at the SMS, the Swampscott Conservancy arranged for his students to build the benches which were installed in early July with the help of Justin Mitchell of the DPW and high schoolers Aidan Gaciale and Nate Stern (pictured).

Located behind the Essex Street cemetery in Swampscott and to the right of the new dog park, the Connector trail leads into the extensive trail network of the Salem's Forest River Conservation Area. Covering over 97 acres, this Conservation Area encompasses tree grooves, dense woodlands, a salt marsh, and an open hilltop with views of the head of Salem Harbor.



- Food-soiled paper products—i.e. Pizza Boxes


NOT ACCEPTED:
