CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Note: Construction and Demolition debris are banned from landfills (MA-DEP) and will not be picked up curbside

C & D Debris: This category generally includes asphalt, bricks, concrete (ABC) and other masonry materials, soil, rock, wall coverings, drywall, plumbing fixtures, insulation, roofing shingles, plate glass, metal, wood waste, cabinetry, doors, electrical wires, etc. Basically, “Construction Debris” means waste building material resulting from construction, remodeling, repair and demolition operations.

Pick-up at home options:

For large amounts you can have a waste company deliver a roll-off dumpster to your driveway. Health Office can provide you with a list of permitted waste contractors. You will require a “Temporary Dumpster Permit”, applications can be obtained through our office. Temp permits last for 45 days and a \$15 fee is required with application.
