Mr. Kane,

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the "Senior Residences at the Machon" project plan. The Open Space & Recreation Plan Committee would like to echo the recent comments of the Conservation Commission.

The "Proposed Ground Coverage Data, Landscaping/Buffers" section of the plan notes that the area in front of the building will be re-landscaped "to include an attractive mix of ornamental plantings including shrubs and trees." Given the problems associated with the spreading of non-native invasive species on town-owned land, and the costs associated with addressing such infestations, like the Commission, we strongly recommend that no invasive species be used in implementation of this project. In choosing shrubs, trees and plants, we recommend that native species be used if possible.

We further recommend avoiding the use of pesticides and herbicides in the maintenance of the property and using organic lawn and plant care instead. Given that the Senior Residences will be near a school playing field and playground, only environmentally friendly landscaping maintenance practices, free of pesticides and herbicides, should be employed.
