- ADU presentation at Sr. center well attended;
- Town holding upcoming idea summits on Hadley and Hawthorne properties to solicit ideas for use
- Swampscott planning board will hold an ADU presentation featuring an expert from AARP and an ADU builder on Monday Jan. 30, 7 pm at the High School; recruiting attendees; encourage neighbors and friends to attend
- Habitat for Humanity will be moving a historic house near Elm St and converting it to four affordable units
- Local developer offered temporary use of 491 Humphrey St. Committee discussed possible use for refugee housing until site is developed; shower would have to be added and would need to insure the building.

Contacted Norman Abbott in US Rep. Moulton's office about funding for ride share project; next round of grant money will be used to increase fleet size; Swampscott could be included but would need to fund operating expenses.

Burlington COA has a transportation program in partnership with Lyft and Go-Go Grandparents for low-income seniors disabled people older than 18 yrs. The first \$1 is paid by rider, next \$10 by city, balance paid by rider. They average about 12 rides/day; town contributes about \$84,000/yr.; Swampscott would probably need lower operating budget. Seeking more information from Lyft and Go-Go Grandparents. Consider requesting funds from town in next budget or apply for AARP grant to conduct a pilot program in Swampscott.
