MINUTES:

The Committee approved the April minutes.

Stakeholder interviews and focus groups are scheduled - with public and private stakeholders, and those under and over 55.

The Committee/ UMass Boston needs assessment survey has had more than 1,500 responses, both online and by mail, including to those under 55. This is 32% out of our town of 14,600!

PATRICIA ZAIDO, co-chair and founder of the Salem For All Ages Committee presented the history of their group. She noted: Keys to success:

- the involvement of Salem City Hall and the Mayor. The Mayor's Chief of Staff is the other co-chair; the Community Development Dept. writes grant proposals; the city does some of the Action Plan projects such as a shuttle bus, and Forest River Park renovations; the city provided original consultant funds; etc.
- Structure, continuity and written plans gets the Committee's goals included in the city (and other groups') plans; assists with grant writing; shows the group is committed to specifics.
- Collaboration with other groups
- Their Action Plans mainly came from the written comments on the public survey (500 responded). Projects were assigned to Task Forces (like Swampscott's Domain subcommittees).
- Working on Age Friendly Business Certificates
- Applied to AARP for grant to start project to encourage elders to rent rooms to college students.

Insights:

• Issues like death and dementia scare people - keeps people from joining the Salem Committee.

- Dominant issues for elders are isolation/depression and communication (about activities, etc.)
- 91% of elders surveyed use the Internet.

Other Swampscott Business:

A discussion ensued about possibly requesting assistive devices at town and community events.
