

LEARN THE TRUTH ABOUT RODENT POISON

AN ACT RELATIVE TO PESTICIDES HOUSE BILL 825 | SENATE BILL 487

Anticoagulant rod enticides (SGARs) are a type of rodent poison that kills by preventing blood from clotting normally, resulting in a fatal hemorrhage. Wildlife and pets are in danger when homeowners and businesses choose to use anticoagulant rodenticides a/k/a rat poisons, to control rodents.

MK the Eagle dies of SGARs poisoning





Using poison has the long-term effect of increasing the rodent population, since it kills off the *natural* predators, allowing rodents to breed unchecked.



Hawkins the Fox was poisoned by SGARs and given his name after Jim Hawkins, sponsor of the bill An act r elative to pesticides calls to decrease the use of Second-Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides (SGARS) in the state, promotes integrated pest management and education, and modernizes pesticide use tracking.

Wildlife & pets can be poisoned by anticoagulant rodenticides in two ways:

Primary poisoning -when an animal directly eats the bait and dies days later.

Secondary poisoning -when a predator or scavenger eats prey that has consumed the bait.

*Secondary poisoning has been well documented in birds of prey like hawks and owls, as well as foxes, bobcats, and coyotes.


