#### **OSRPC 2020 Annual Report**

The Open Space & Recreation Plan Committee's (OSRPC) purpose is to carry out the goals of the 2013 Open Space & Recreation Plan (OSRP). The Open Space & Recreation Plan identified, inventoried, and prioritized Swampscott's open spaces and recreation facilities, and proposed recommendations for their maintenance, preservation, and expansion. The following report outlines the committee's accomplishments in 2020.

### 2020 Accomplishments

- 1. Created and submitted a new OSRP for 2020
- 2. Tree Task Force developed and passed street tree by-law
- 3. Assisted in the creation of a community garden at Bertram House
- 4. Created maintenance programs for Harold King Forest and Ewing Woods
- 5. Assisted in the creation of a dog park at the Swampscott Cemetery
- 6. Addressed encroachment of open space by residents
- 7. Created a trail map for Harold King Forest
- 8. Eliminated boat storage in parking lot to provide public parking year round at Fisherman's beach
- 9. Assisted with installing a pollinator garden at Town Hall
- 10. Saved mature trees at the Machon School building site

### **Plan Goals in Progress**

- 1. Establishment of a "green corridor" for walkability and wildlife
- 2. Creation of trail maps Charles M. Ewing Woods, Upper Jackson Park
- 3. Establish rail trail along abandoned railroad line
- 4. Monitor White Court/Blythswood public access path
- 5. Pursue effort to have DCR take over or share maintenance (Kings Beach)
- 6. Establish a conservation restriction for Jackson Park
- 7. Increase open space and trails around the Foster Pond and Harold King Forest area
- 8. Plant coastal-worthy trees without blocking water views (shade, aesthetics, stormwater control) Blaney Beach & Reservation, King's Beach, Polisson Park, Johnson Park
- 9. Limit impact of (potential) school construction on conservation land Ewing Woods
- 10. Determine size scale and number of monuments along Monument Avenue mall
- 11. Work to adopt the Community Preservation Act
- 12. Develop policies for Town acquisition of private land

- 13. Purchase vacant land for open space
- 14. Incorporate open space & recreation goals into land use planning and zoning
- 15. Reduce pesticide use or replace with organic options
- 16. Conduct assessment and control plan of invasive plants
- 17. Develop plan for replacement of aged/ailing street trees
- 18. Add funding for more street trees to improve canopy
- 19. Assist in ADA compliancy for recreation areas
- 20. Identify and certify vernal pools
- 21. Continued oversight of sewer and outflow work at Kings Beach
- 22. Continued oversight of seawall repair at Kings Beach and Eisman's Beach

#### New plan goals

- 1. Develop a native planting policy
- 2. Develop a wetlands protection by-law
- 3. Provide education in schools on the importance of open space
- 4. Address light pollution at night
